

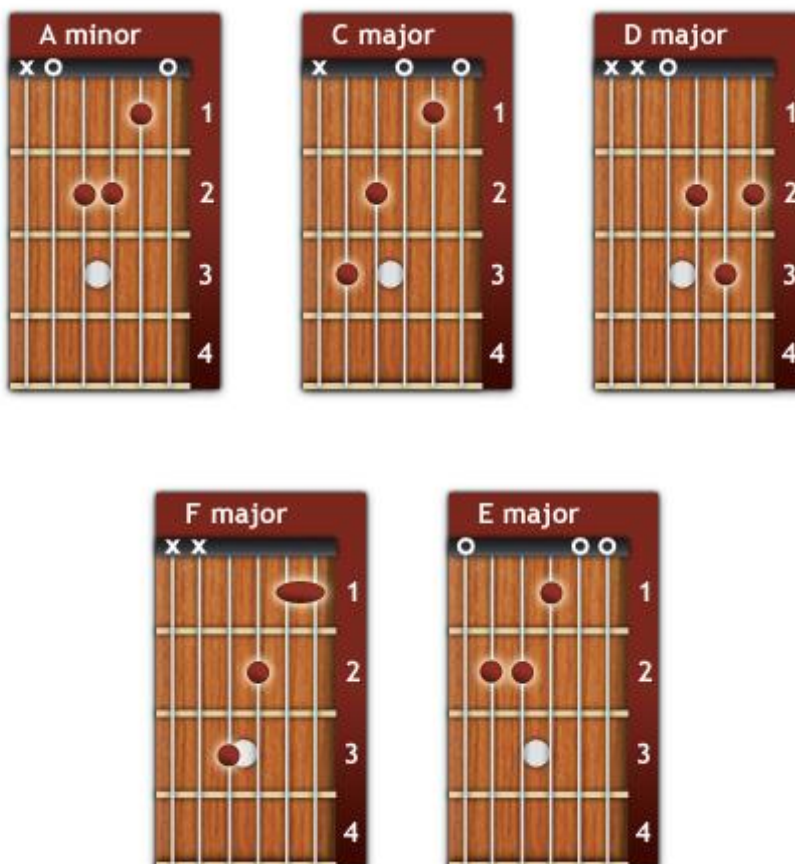
## House of the Rising Sun Guitar Tabs and Chords


### Chords

These are the chords you'll need to play the song, practice the F major a lot. It's a bit difficult at first, but it'll come with enough practice.




## Tabs - Arpeggio

### Arpeggio 1





### Arpeggio 2



















*Solo 1*



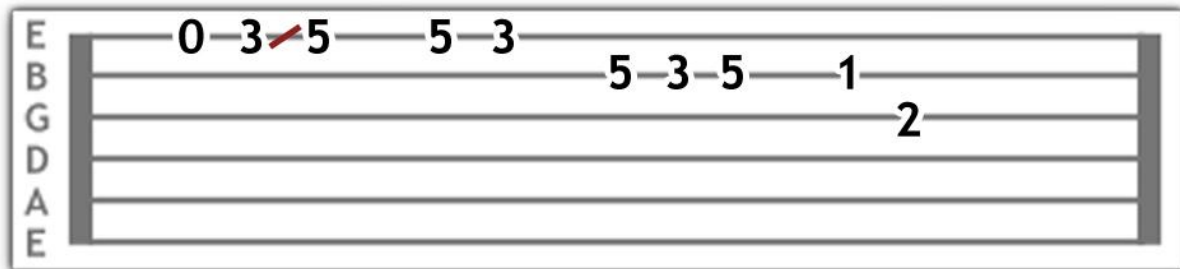

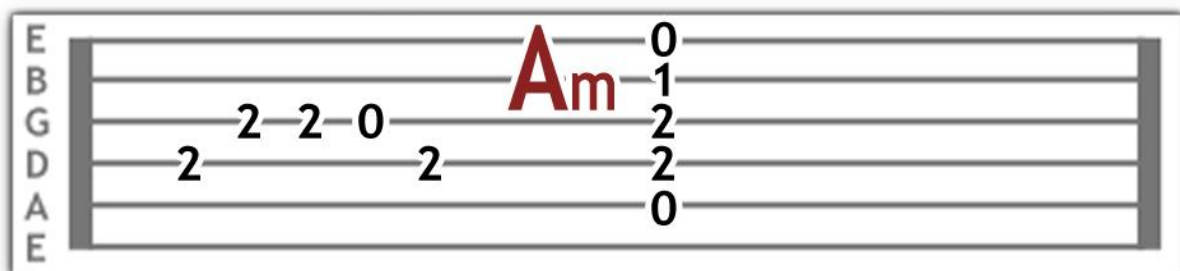
