


Let it Be Guitar Tabs and Chords

Chords


Let it be is played by finger picking a couple of chords. Learning them well and getting a hang of the picking pattern is the key to playing the song.



Picking Patterns


These are the picking patterns for the different chords, you will find the chord progressions below them.

Finger picking pattern C major





Finger picking pattern G major





Finger picking pattern A minor





Intro 1.1 – Use the picking patterns you learned above.






Chorus 1.1 – Remember to pick at the low E string on C/G, not the A string as with the other chords.
