

## Brown Eyed Girl Guitar Tabs and Chords

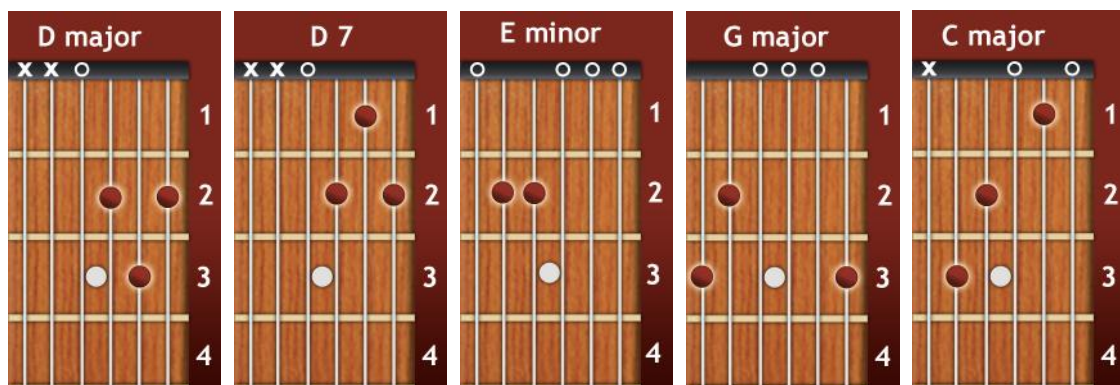

The intro will give you a bit of a challenge though, so keep it slow at first, and speed up later on.


## Chords

These are the chords you'll be using during Brown Eyed Girl:



# Tabs

## Intro V1



The first diagram shows a G major scale on the high E string (3-5-7-5-3) and the G string (4-5-7-5-4) with a 3rd interval. The second diagram shows a C major scale on the high E string (3-5-7-5-3) and the G string (4-5-7-5-4) with a 3rd interval, plus a C major scale on the B string (2-2-3-5) and the G string (3-2).

Keep in mind that you are playing 3rds, which means you're playing notes along the major scale, as well as the respective 3<sup>rd</sup> degree note. We have 2 scales here, the first one is G, the second is C.


Let's have an example quickly, here are the notes in the G major scale are:

G – A – B – C – D – E – F# – G


I – II – III – IV – V – IV – III – II – I

Frets 3, 5 and 7 on the high E string are notes G, A and B, the first 3 degrees of the G major scale. To get the third interval from each, we simply count up the scale tones, so the third of a G note on the G major scale is B, the third of A is C, and the third of B is D. The thirds correspond to the notes played in the G string. You can do the same on the C major scale, or any other scale for that matter. Thirds will always sound good.

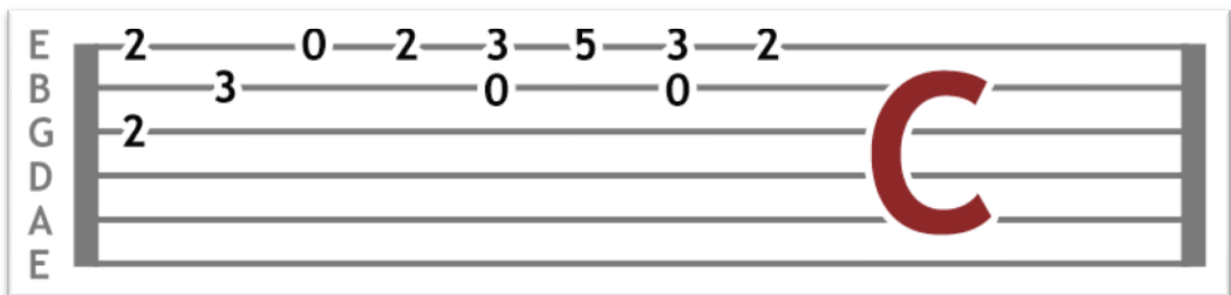
