

Dust in the Wind Guitar Chords and Tabs



Make sure you listen to the original recording, and also keep in mind that the backing track is on the lesson page as well.




These are the chords you'll be using during the Dust in the Wind:









Picking Pattern

Keep in mind that some of the chords require a slightly different picking pattern, meaning that you'll need to play the lowest string of each chord (which won't always be the A string), and also the highest string (which won't always be the B string).





Sequence of Parts

Here is the sequence of chords to Dust in the Wind. The song is in 4/4 time, you play 2

rounds of the picking pattern per bar.
