

Plush Guitar Tabs and Chords

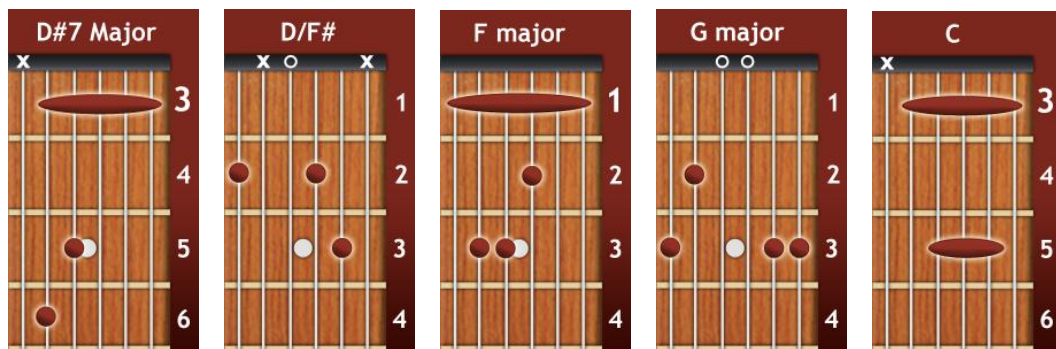

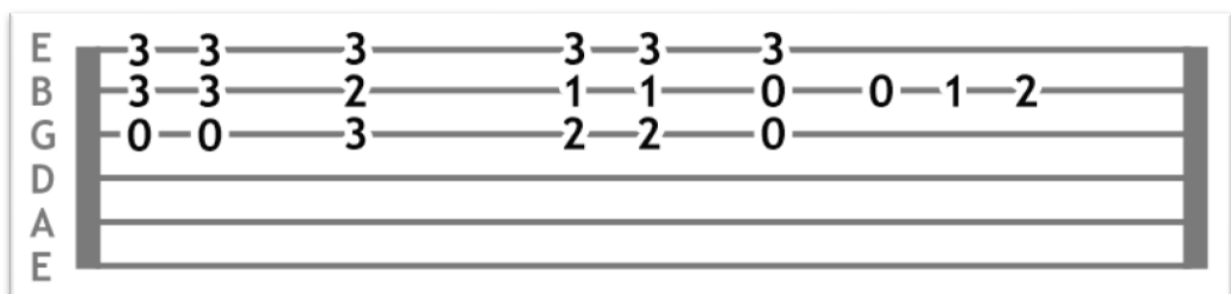
Chords

Chorus 1





Chorus 2





Bridge




Chorus on 2nd guitar






