

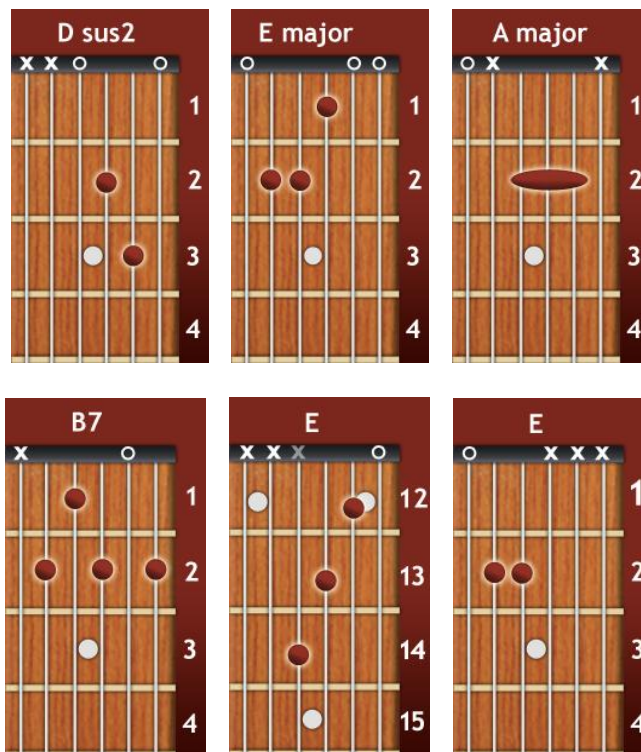
Rumble Guitar Tabs and Chords

Hi, hope you enjoyed the video, make sure you add plenty of distortion, since as you'll know, Rumble was one of the first songs ever to experiment with distortion back in the end of the 80's.


Chords

These are the chords you'll be using to play Rumble:



Tabs

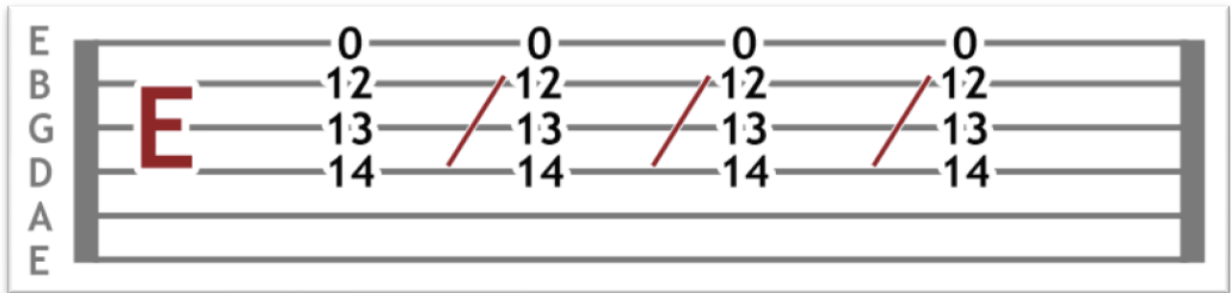
Main riff



The main riff is composed of four staves of guitar tablature:

- Staff 1:** Shows two measures of chords. The first measure contains two D_{sus2} chords followed by an E chord. The second measure contains two D_{sus2} chords followed by an E chord.
- Staff 2:** Shows two measures of chords. The first measure contains two D_{sus2} chords followed by an A chord. The second measure contains two D_{sus2} chords followed by an E chord.
- Staff 3:** Shows two measures of chords. The first measure contains two D_{sus2} chords. The second measure contains a B₇ chord with fret numbers 0-1-2 on the G, D, and A strings.
- Staff 4:** Shows a single measure of a melodic line with fret numbers: 3-0 on the E string, 3-0 on the B string, 2-0 on the G string, 2-0 on the D string, 2-0 on the A string, and 3-0 on the E string. A red arrow points to the 3rd fret on the E string.
