

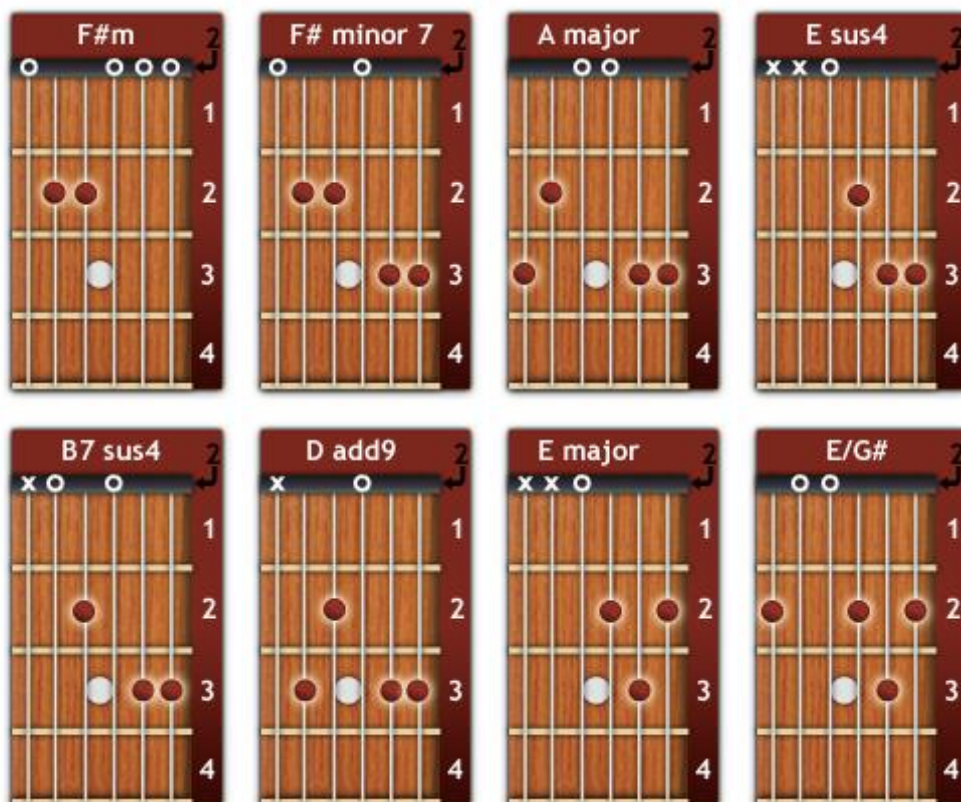
Wonderwall Guitar Tabs and Chords

Chords

These are the chords you'll be playing, remember to place your capo at fret 2. Just for practice, I denoted the names of the chords based on their actual tone (offset by 2 semitones). Don't forget that these are chord shapes you already know, it's just their tone that is different because of the capo:

Intro 1



Intro 2






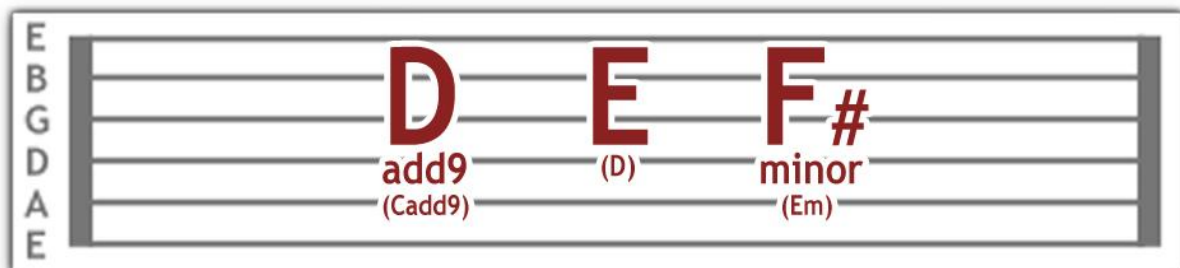

Intro Chords Together



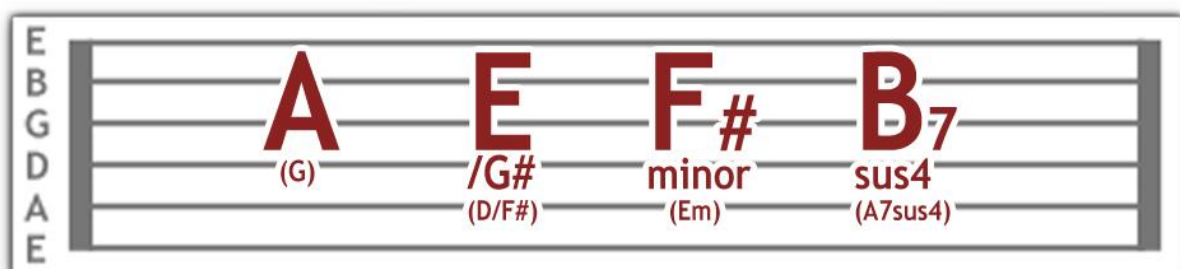
Bridge 1 – This will be another listening exercise, listen to the song (or lesson) for the strumming pattern.



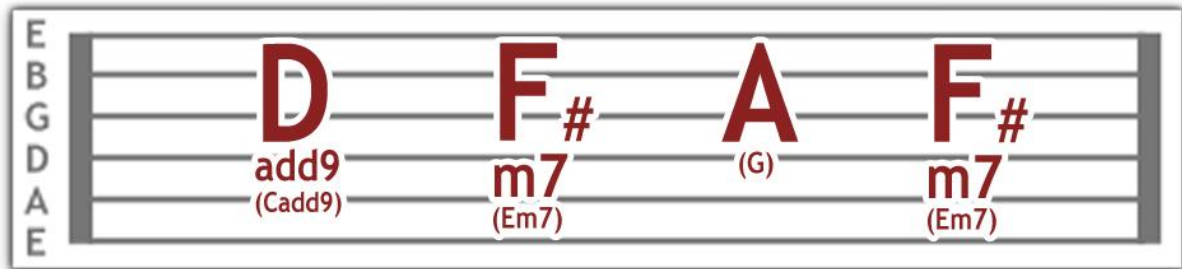
