

You Never Can Tell Guitar Tabs

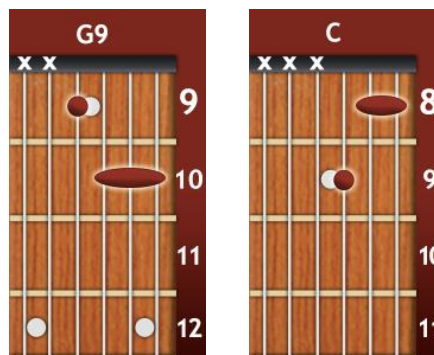

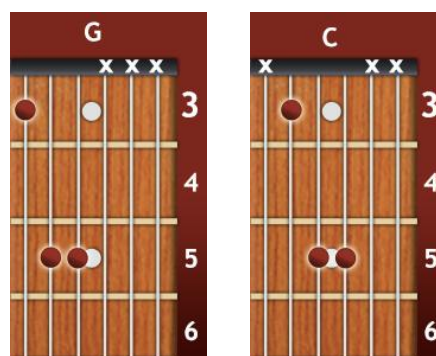
Other than the intro, the song is really simple, and suitable for beginners. Concerning the intro, getting used to the chord changes will take a bit of time, but not much.

Chords


These are the chords you'll be using during the intro to You Never Can Tell:



And here are the power chords for the verse:




Intro tabs





Verse tabs

During the verse, you'll be playing power chords, and have a simple turnaround in the end. Here is your strumming pattern for each power chord:



And your chord progression:

Solo tabs

The solo (which is originally played on the piano) is played on the C major scale, it's fairly simple as well:








